## Co-op food stores reeling in eco-friendly catch

(May 4, 2012) -- Co-op food stores have gone eco-fishing. And what they've reeled in for their customers is ocean-friendly seafood options and a new labeling system to help them make environmentally responsible choices when buying fresh and frozen seafood products.

The 165 Co-op food stores that carry fresh and frozen seafood in Western Canada are taking part in the **"Reel in the Solution!"** sustainable seafood program developed by Federated Co-operatives Limited (FCL) in partnership with SeaChoice, a consortium of five nationally respected Canadian conservation organizations that undertake scientific assessment of the environmental sustainability of wild fisheries and aquaculture products.

"The Co-operative Retailing System (CRS) and your local Co-op food store care about healthy oceans and sustainable fish stocks," says Vic Huard, FCL Vice President, Corporate Affairs. "With the support and guidance of SeaChoice, we are pleased to introduce the **"Reel in the Solution!"** program as the next step in our commitment to becoming a leader around sustainable fisheries and aquaculture at all levels of the seafood supply chain – from ocean to store to dinner table."

During the past year, FCL has worked with SeaChoice in identifying fresh and frozen seafood products ranked as "Avoid" by SeaChoice's scientific assessments due to population concerns, harm to endangered species and/or unsustainable fishing methods. As a result of this extensive review, products removed were Atlantic Halibut, Blue Marlin, Shark, Chilean Sea Bass, longlined Swordfish, Skates, Rays and Orange Roughy. Customers are encouraged to consider the following options: Arctic Char, Sablefish, Steelhead Trout, Rainbow Trout, Dungeness Crab and Mussels.

SeaChoice's ranking and labeling of fish stock has been adopted with information and signage posted on products and by fresh fish counters and freezer shelves. A green SeaChoice label indicates a "Best Choice" item that is well managed, abundant, and caught or farmed in environmentally sustainable ways. A yellow label identifies a "Some Concerns" item and red label signals an item to "Avoid".

SeaChoice's Kelly Roebuck applauds the co-operative retailing system for its support of oceanfriendly fisheries and aquaculture.

"FCL, supplier partners, Co-op food stores and their customers can take pride in knowing their efforts are helping to ensure the long term viability of our oceans and the products harvested from them. Together, we are making a positive difference for the health of our oceans," says Roebuck.

Troy Verboom, General Manager, Sherwood Co-op in Regina, is appreciative of the leadership provided by FCL and SeaChoice in raising awareness around sustainable seafood and sourcing ocean-friendly product.

And to help them make well-informed choices, they will see various point-of-sale materials such as handouts, pocket guides, posters, banners, and the new labeling system promoting our sustainable seafood program," says Verboom.

FCL began its partnership with SeaChoice in 2010 to help fulfill its commitment to sourcing sustainable seafood products for customers. Last year FCL worked closely with Sea Choice to develop and adopt a sustainable seafood policy built on six guiding principles: commitment, procurement, transparency, information, education, and support industry reform of sustainable seafood practices and policies.
